**Volunteer Training Levels:** The RideAbility volunteers advance through levels of training according to the work they have experienced and the extra training they have completed. There are 4 levels of volunteers – and in addition there are Horse Exercise volunteers and Horse Leader Trained volunteers. The levels are explained below.

Rookie Volunteer Level:	<ul> <li>A new volunteer who has completed at least the mandatory one hour training and filled out and handed in the following forms:</li> <li>Volunteer Application</li> <li>Participation Form (with all signatures)</li> </ul>
Bronze Volunteer Level:	<ul> <li>An experienced volunteer who has worked as a Rookie volunteer for at least 40 hours of volunteer time for RideAbility and has:</li> <li>Completed and handed in the RideAbility volunteer self-test</li> <li>Continued to complete a Participation form annually</li> </ul>
Silver Volunteer Level:	<ul> <li>An experienced volunteer who has worked as a Bronze volunteer for at least 40 hours (for a total of 80 hours) of volunteer time for RideAbility and has:</li> <li>Viewed three equine related or RideAbility approved safety/training videos</li> <li>Continued to complete a Participation form annually</li> </ul>
Gold Volunteer Level:	<ul> <li>An experienced volunteer who has worked as a Silver volunteer for at least 40 hours (for a total of 120 hours) of volunteer time for RideAbility and has:</li> <li>Read one of the designated RideAbility safety/training books</li> <li>Volunteered on at least one staff team</li> <li>Continued to complete a Participation form annually</li> </ul>
Horse Leader Volunteer:	A volunteer who has completed the horse leader training checklist.
Horse Exercise Volunteer:	A volunteer who has completed the horse exercise checklist.
Buddy Riding Volunteer:	A volunteer of at least bronze level who has completed the defined Buddy Riding requirements to achieve this level of responsibility with the horses.

*Note:* The volunteer hours can be accumulated doing any job related to RideAbility. These jobs include but are not limited to: Gatekeeper, barn cleaning and maintenance, sidewalking, horse leading, fundraising, presentations, office work, parades, horse exercising, instructing classes.
